



2024 New Zealand WASZP National Championships

Notice of Race

The Organising Authority is the Takapuna Boating Club Inc. (TBC)
39 The Strand | Takapuna Beach 0622

NB: The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification and the notation '[NP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race means rules that are not grounds for protest by a boat.

1. Rules

- 1.1. The event will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing ("RRS") and the WASZP Class rules.
- 1.2. The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply.
- 1.3. Appendix T shall apply.
- 1.4. RRS 35, A4 and A5 may be changed in the Sailing Instructions to allow for a "Grand Prix Style" finish.

2. Advertising [DP]

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority.

3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1. The event is open to boats of the WASZP Class and whose sailors are current financial members of their respective class association and National Member Authority.
- 3.2. Eligible skippers may enter by completing the online entry form at www.takapunaboating.org.nz.
by 1700hrs 28th February 2024.
- 3.3. Late entries accompanied by the late entry fee may be accepted at the Race Committee's discretion until 1700hrs on 15th March 2024.

4. Fees

- 4.1. The entry fee is \$200.00 (includes \$50.00 - Class Association Subscriptions for 2024).
- 4.2. The entry fee for entrants on Saturday 16th and Sunday 17th only is \$150.00 (including Class Association Subscriptions).

4.3. The entry fee for entrants in the Waszp X Class is \$100.00 (including Class Association Subscriptions).

4.4. The late fee for the NZ National Championships is an additional \$50.00.

5. Schedule

5.1. Registration

Saturday 16th March 2024

0800 – 0900hrs

5.2. Briefing

- (a) The briefing for the National Championship is scheduled for 0915 on Saturday 16th March 2024 in the TBC Clubhouse.

6. Dates of Racing

Saturday 16 th March	Race Day 1	1 st Warning Signal not before: 1100	4 Races
Sunday 17 th March	Race Day 2	1 st Warning Signal not before: 0900	4 Races
Monday 18 th March	Race Day 3	1 st Warning Signal not before: 0900	4 Races

6.1. Number of Races

- (a) 12 Races are scheduled for the series.
- (b) Up to 6 races may be sailed per day.
- (c) On Monday 18th March no warning signal will be made after 1600.

7. Measurement

7.1. All boats must comply with the rules of the WASZP Class.

7.2. Other than the Waszp X, competitors may choose to sail with either a 6.9m² or an 8.2m² rig. The rig to be used for the regatta shall be declared at registration. No swapping of rig sizes during the National Championships will be permitted.

7.3. A member of the Race Committee may direct any competing boat be checked at any time during the event.

7.4. All beach trailers/trolleys must have boat names and numbers clearly marked on them.

8. Sailing Instructions

The Sailing Instructions will only be available online and a copy posted on the Official Notice Board. The Sailing Instructions may also be posted on the TBC website and/or NZ WASZP Facebook page prior to registration.

9. Venue

Addendum A shows the location of the event venue and approximate location of the preferred racing areas.

Note that other sailing areas in the general proximity of the TBC may be used.

10. Courses to be Sailed

10.1. The courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward and may have a reaching finish.

10.2. The target time for each race will be 20 minutes for the leading boat.

11. Penalty System

Rule 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that the 'Two-Turns' penalty is replaced by a 270° degree turn. On a windward leg the turn shall comprise of a gybe, and on a downwind leg, the turn shall comprise a tack.

12. Scoring

12.1. 5 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

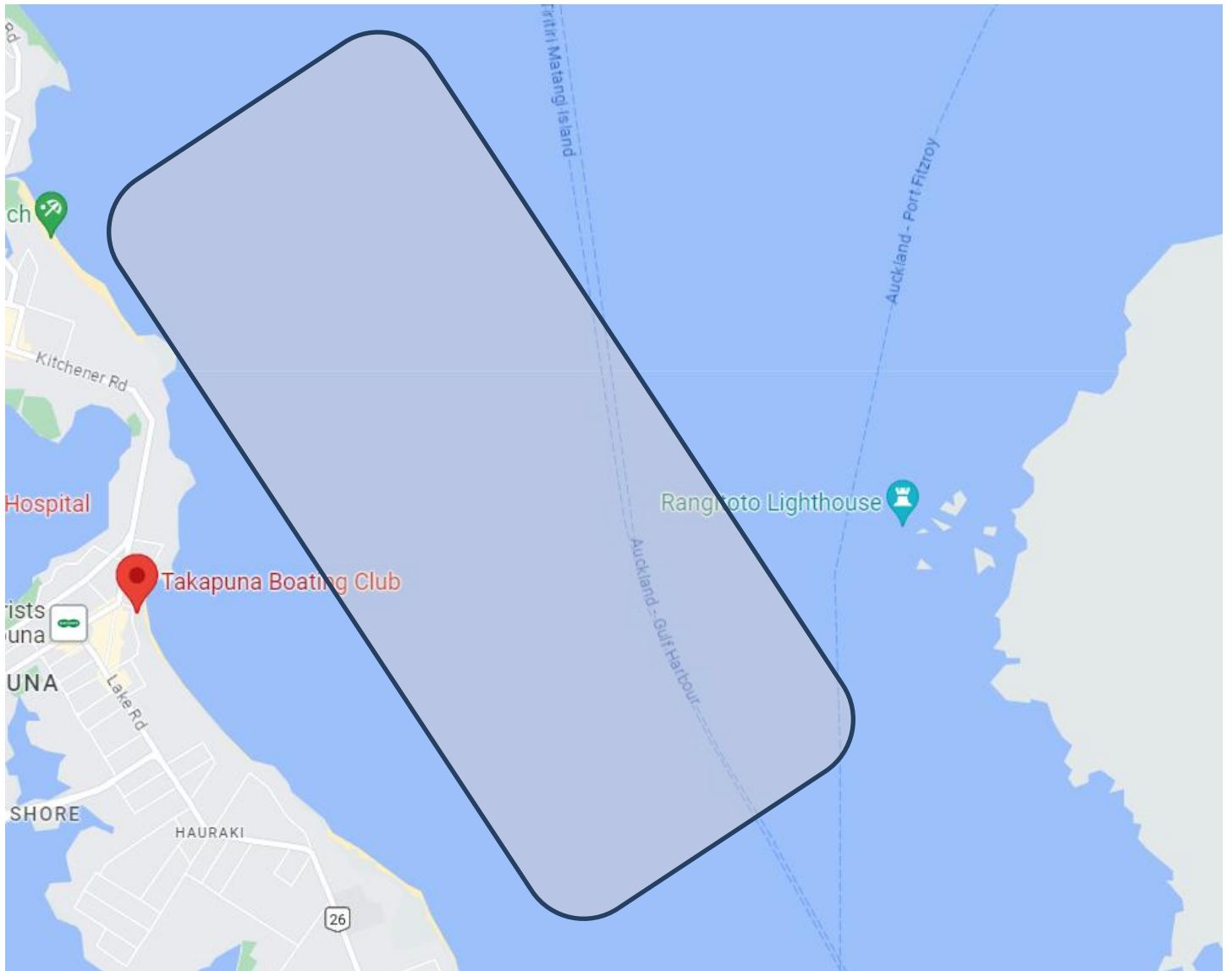
12.2. When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

12.3. When from 6 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

12.4. When 9 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two (2) worst scores.
