### Notice of Race

#### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, 2021 – 2024.
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply.
- 1.3 Appendix T, Arbitration, will apply

#### 2 Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be available no later than 11th March 2022 on the notice board in the main deck of Takapuna Boating Club Clubhouse, and on the club website.
- 2.2 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board.

#### 3 Communications

- 3.1 The official notice board is located on the main deck of the Takapuna Boating Club Clubhouse
- 3.2 The online official notice board is located at <https://www.takapunaboating.org.nz/calendar/2022-470class-national-championships-nor/>
- 3.3 Radio communication: Except in an emergency, a competitor shall neither make nor receive radio transmissions while racing that are not available to all competitors. This restriction includes mobile phones.

#### 4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the 470 Class that comply with the International 470 class rules

**4.2** Boats may enter by completing the entry form and submitting it, together with the required fee, to <https://www.takapunaboating.org.nz/webform/470class-national-champs-entry/>

**4.3** Boats may enter the event by submitting a completed entry form and payment at the club office.

**4.4** No entries will be accepted after 1600 Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2022

**4.5** To be eligible to compete in this event each entrant and crew member shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the entrant's and crew member's national authority. Proof to be presented at registration.

## **5 FEES**

**5.1** Entry fees are as follows:

**5.2** At registration please provide:

- a) Proof of club and class association membership,
- b) Evidence of third party insurance,
- c) Proof of age if requested,
- d) Parental permission, for those under the age of 18 years.

## **6 ADVERTISING**

**6.1** Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority or the class association.

### 7.4 The scheduled times of the warning signal for the first race each day are:

On Friday 18th March 2022 the first warning is scheduled for 1155.

On Saturday 19th March 2022 the first warning is scheduled not before 1055.

On Sunday 20th March 2022 the first warning is scheduled not before 1055.

### 7.5 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1500.

## 8 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

8.1 Each boat shall produce or verify the existence of a valid measurement certificate or declaration of compliance at registration.

8.2 Boats may be inspected at any time for safety, measurement and/or weighing.

8.3 [DP] Boats shall comply with RRS 78.1

## 9 VENUE

9.1 NoR Addendum **A** shows the plan of the event venue.

9.2 NoR Addendum **B** shows the location of the racing areas.

## 10 COURSES

10.1 Courses may be Windward/Leeward OR Trapezoid

## 11 SCORING

11.1 Twelve races are scheduled.

11.2 Five races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

11.3 When fewer than six races have been completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores.

11.4 When six to eleven races have been completed, her score shall be the total of her races scores excluding her worst score.

**11.5** When twelve races have been completed, her score shall be the total of her races scores excluding her two worst scores.

## **12 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS**

**12.1** [DP] Support person vessels shall be registered at registration.

## **13 RISK STATEMENT**

**13.1** RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

## **14 INSURANCE**

**14.1** Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident or the equivalent. Certificate of insurance is to be presented at registration.

## **15 CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS**

**15.1** A chartered or loaned boat may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of her class rules, provided that the race committee has approved her sail identification before the first race.

## **16 PRIZES**

**16.1** Prizes will be given as follows:

Trophies are for First male crew, first female crew, first mixed crew, open crew. There may be prizes for open and mixed second and third places, and for open and female second and third places.

"New Zealand National Champion" is only available to Residents of New Zealand.

## **17 Covid 19 Pandemic**

**17.1** In accordance with the New Zealand COVID-19 Protection Framework (traffic light system) all competitors, volunteers, supporters, coaches, and event staff that attend the event need to be fully vaccinated against COVID 19 and provide documented proof on entry, or obtain a medical exemption.

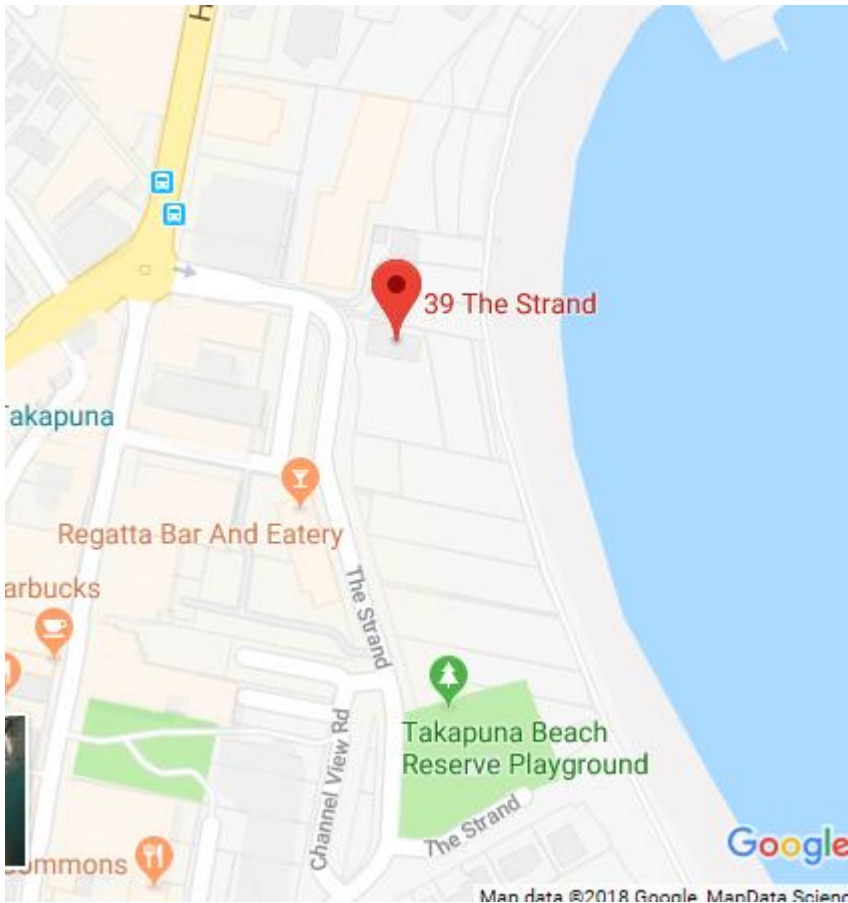
**17.2** Any person who obtains a medical exemption may be required to do a COVID test prior to participation in the event.
